### Parish Meeting

A parish meeting was held at the Church House, Long Ashton on Monday the 5<sup>th</sup> March 1934 for the triennial election of members of the Parish Council.

Mr Fry moved, Mr Hollis seconded that Mr Ernest P West take the chair for this portion of the business.

The proposition was carried and Mr West at 7.35 asked that nominations might be handed in.

After an interval of the statutory 15 minutes he announced there were 12 nominations for the eleven seats and asked if any candidate desired to withdraw.

As there was not any withdrawals the meeting proceeded to an election by a show of hands the Chairman eventually announcing the result as follows:

Ball Oliver John 29, George Edward Childe 32, Harrington Alfred Charles Fry 32, George Edwin Gait 30, Witt Edward James Armstrong 29, Charles John Bright 28, Graham Tissington 27, Edward Albert Hicks 26, Sidney Mitchell 25, Sidney Herbert Barnes 24, Herbert Jefferies 23, Richard William Hollis 23.

A tie resulting for the eleventh seat the Chairman gave his vote in favour of the Chairman of the Council, Mr Jefferies and declared the first eleven persons duly elected as members of the Council.

Mr Jefferies on taking the chair for the remainder of the business thanked the meeting on behalf of the other members and himself for their election.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and signed, the Chairman explaining what had been done as to matters arising out of same.

### Charity Trustee Accounts

The Clerk (Mr R E March) read the accounts of the Parochial Charity for the year 1933 which showed that the balance of £138.15.10 had been increased to £142.17.8.

### Street Lighting

Provisional accounts for the year ending March 1934 were submitted same showing that £220 had been received from the Rating Authority and after expenditure of £217.9.6 there remained a balance of £16.18.7.

After a reference to lighting Leigh Woods and erection of further lamps in other parts of the parish had been made Mr Morrish moved that the sum of

£240 be raised to cover expenses in connection with street lighting for the year ending March 1935 seconded by Mr Bright and carried.

#### Collection of House Refuse

Mr R E Milner referred to the collection of house refused in Leigh Woods and moved that the attention of the District Council be drawn that the present method of collection in Leigh Woods was far from satisfactory, seconded by Mr Armstrong and carried.

#### Bristol Tramways and Carried Co Ltd

Mr Dowdney moved that the Bristol Tramways & Carriage Co Ltd be again written asking them to be good enough to consider the advisability of extending the present 4d fare section from Bristol to the Post Office, to the Cider Institute seconded by Mr Hollis and carried.

#### Fences at Council Houses – Providence

Mr W G Poole stated the fences dividing the gardens and also the houses at Providence had been taken down and asked enquiries of the R D Council be made as to when same would be erected, seconded by Mr T T Barnes and carried.

5<sup>th</sup> March 1934

Parish Council

A meeting of the Parish Council was held at the close of the Parish Meeting Mr H Jefferies presiding over the following members Messrs H S Barnes, TT Barnes, Childe, Fry, Gait and Hollis. Mr Ball was unable to attend through illness.

Mr Hollis thanked the members for their pleasant association and whole a member of the council and the Chairman on behalf of the Council expressed their regret that they would not have the assistance of Mr Hollis in the future.

Minutes of the previous meeting read and signed.

Arising Out of Same

Lamp – Hillside Road

Clerk reported that Mr Ball had inspected lamp in Hillside Road and suggested no action be taken.

Wall – Mount Pleasant

Letter of the 18<sup>th</sup> January 1934 from the Ashton Court Estate was read in which it was stated the Estate was quite prepared to admit this obstruction would appear to be very dangerous to foot passengers and would raise objection to the removal of same but any expense entailed must be borne by the Parish Council in conjunction with the County Council.

In consequence of this reply the Clerk reported re-opening negotiations with the County Council by letter of the 24 January 1934 and read reply of the County Surveyor of 25 January that he would bring matter before next meeting of appropriate Committee of County Council.

Action of Clerk confirmed.

With reference to pools of water remaining in the roadway near this wall, Clerk stated the local surveyor had informed him matter would receive attention when road repaired.

Special Expenses Account

Statement of Income and Expenditure for the year ending March 1933 in connection with sewerage, water and scavenging was placed before the meeting.

Clerk's Fidelity Bond

Receipt of yearly premium on Fidelity Bond was produced by the Clerk.

#### Notice of Parish Meeting

The Council was informed that papers in connection with the calling of the parish meeting for the election of members of the Parish Council were not received before the 21<sup>st</sup> Feb and as 7 days notice was required to be given of the calling of this meeting reception of same did not give sufficient time for the necessary posters to be prepared and printed.

It was decided on the motion of Mr H S Barnes seconded by Mr T T Barnes to write the Home Office on the matter.

#### Precept

Expenses for the year being estimated as follows:

Lighting £240; Fire Brigade £25; General £50, Mr Childe moved, Mr Fry seconded a precept of £157.10 be served on the Rating Authority for the first half year. Carried.

#### Next Meeting

The next meeting was fixed for Tuesday 17 April.

#### Footpath – Wilde Country Lane

Mr T T Barnes stated a footpath leading from Wild Country Lane over the property of the Research Station had been stopped and moved, that the Research Station authorities be written on the matter seconded by Mr Fry and carried.

#### Widening Ashton Bridge

It was decided on the motion of Mr H S Barnes seconded by Mr Fry to ascertain whether the County Council had sanctioned a grant towards the expenses of the road improvement at the Ashton boundary and if so, to state this Council were of the opinion that the unemployed workmen of this parish should share an equal proportion of the work with those unemployed in Bristol.

#### Clevedon Road

It was also decided to draw the attention of the County Council to the condition of the footpath leading from Cambridge Batch to Kencote Mill.

#### Mr T T Barnes

Mr Jefferies moved that the best thanks of the Council be given Mr T T Barnes for the help he had given while a member of the Council expressed regret of the members he did not see his way to seek re-election. Seconded by Mr Fry. Mr Barnes suitably replied.

17 April 1934

Parish Council

The Annual Meeting of the Parish Council was held at the Church House, Long Ashton on Tuesday the 17<sup>th</sup> April when the following members were present Messrs Armstrong, Ball, Barnes, Bright, Childe, Fry, Gait, Hicks, Jefferies, Mitchell and Tissington.

Each having signed "Acceptance of Office".

Chairman

Mr Ball moved that Mr Jefferies be re-elected Chairman, seconded by Mr Childe and carried.

Vice Chairman

On the motion of Mr Mitchell seconded by Mr Armstrong Mr Fry was re-elected Vice Chairman.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and confirmed.

Arising out of same

Wall – Mount Pleasant

Clerk read letter from County Surveyor of the 28 March in which he stated the County Council the previous day had authorised the carrying out of the work of removing the obstruction to the footpath at Mount Pleasant. On the motion of Mr Fry seconded by Mr Tessionton it was decided to send copy of this letter to the Agent Ashton Court Estate.

Notice – Parish Meeting

Home Office had acknowledged receipt of letter of the 8 March.

Footpath – Wilde Country Lane

Mr West wrote by letter of the 12 March that the footpath referred to was not a public right of way.

Ashton Bridge – Road Improvement

Clerk read reply of the County Surveyor as to this matter, also one from the City Engineer, Bristol of 14 March in which he stated the whole of the work was being carried out at the cost of the Bristol Corporation.

Footpath – Clevedon Road

Letter from County Surveyor of the 24 March stated this footpath is now being put in order.

Mr Childe suggested the County Council be informed it was considered very dangerous owing to its being so narrow and the erection of electric light poles thereon, seconded by Mr Barnes and carried.

#### School Manager

Mr Barnes moved that Mr R E March be the Council's representative on the managing body of the Long Ashton Parochial School for the period of 3 years subject however to the provision that he may resign or be removed by the appointing body but otherwise shall continue to act until his successor is appointed, seconded by Mr Childe and carried.

#### Allotment Committee

The following were elected to serve on Allotment Committee, Messrs. Ball, Barnes, Bright, Childe, Gait, Hicks, Mitchell and Tissington.

#### Local Government Act 1933 – Section 266

Standing Orders as to Contracts similar to those suggested by Ministry of Health 28 March 1934 were adopted on the proposition of Mr Tissington seconded by Mr Barnes.

#### Rights of Way Act 1932

Letter from the Rural District Council of the 5<sup>th</sup> March enquiring whether this Council would co-operate with them in preparing a map preferably from a 6 in O.M., showing which in the opinion of the Parish Council are the established and reputed public right of way in the parish, was read and it was decided to inform the District Council, the Council was willing to assist them in the matter and that they were already in possession of a map with the footpaths clearly defined.

#### Leigh Woods – Lighting

A letter was read from the Secretary of Mr Melville Wills stating he understood it was proposed to install six lights in Leigh Woods but felt that before this done, lights paid for by him should be taken over.

On the proposition of Mr Bright seconded by Mr Barnes it was decided to acknowledge receipt of letter and to inform Mr Wills that same would receive attention.

Mr Fry moved that Messrs Armstrong Hicks and Tissington be elected a Sub-Committee to visit Leigh Woods with a view to selecting six suitable places for the erection of lamps there and report at next meeting. Carried.

#### Clevedon Road – Lighting

It was decided on the motion of Mr Childe seconded by Mr Barnes that another lamp be affixed in Clevedon Road.

#### Footpaths

Mr Bright moved that the attention of Ashton Court Estate be drawn to the condition of the footpath near the Almshouses leading from the Main Road to Ridgeway as well as that running from the main road past Rockdale to Rayens Cross Road, seconded by Mr Barnes and carried.

#### Parish Meeting Correspondence

##### Collection of House Refuse – Leigh Woods

Mr Fry stated it had been decided to make a collection here twice a month.

##### Bristol Tramway and Carriage Co – Fares

The Traffic Manager by letter of 10 March stated the Council's letter was receiving attention.

##### Fences – Council Houses – Providence

Mr Bright stated this matter had been well attended to.

Carried.

## Flushing Tank – Providence

It was decided to enquire of the R D C whether the flushing tank at Providence was in working order and if anyone was engaged by them in attending to same.

Next Meeting – The next meeting was fixed for 26 June.

Parish Council

The quarterly meeting of the Council was held at the Church House, Long Ashton on Tuesday the 19<sup>th</sup> June 1934 when Mr Jefferies presided over the following members, Messrs Ball, Bright, Childe, Fry, Hicks, Mitchell and Tissington.

Apologies for non attendance were received from Messrs. Armstrong, Gait and Hicks.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and signed.

Arising out of same

Wall – Mount Pleasant

Clerk reported sending copy of the County Surveyor's letter of the 28<sup>th</sup> March to the Ashton Court Estate and it was decided on the motion of Mr Ball, seconded by Mr Childe to thank the Ashton Court Estate for the assistance they had given towards the removal of this obstruction.

Footpath – Clevedon Road

Letter of the County Surveyor of the 30<sup>th</sup> April was read in which he stated the widening of this footpath would entail the purchase of property and the widening of the carriage way, which would be a fairly expensive matter and of a type the County Council are not incurring at the present time on the grounds of economy.

Mr Childe moved that the County Council be informed this Council is still of opinion this footpath is very dangerous owing to its narrowness and to the poles standing thereof and suggest that the poles be removed seconded by Mr Ball and carried.

Rights of Way Act 1932

Clerk of the R D Council by letter of the 26<sup>th</sup> April stated his Council would be glad to have a loan of the parish map at a later date when they were considering the matter.

Leigh Woods Lighting

The Clerk stated he had written Mr Wills's Secretary as directed at the previous meeting.

Footpaths near Almshouses and Rockdale (Brock's)

Mr Worrall, Agent Ashton Court Estate wrote by letter of the 26<sup>th</sup> April that the footpath near the Almshouses had for part of its length been diverted and made up by this estate solely on account of building development which had taken place and in no way affected the old existing footpath.

As regards the footpath leading past Rockdale, he was prepared on behalf of the Estate, entirely without prejudice to contribute half the cost of repairing and making up this pathway on receiving an assurance from this Council that they would undertake future liability for repair and upkeep.

The Clerk was directed to report at the next meeting as to whether the Local Government Act 1933 affected the repair of footpaths.

#### Collection of House Refuse – Leigh Woods

Clerk R D Council wrote by letter of the 20<sup>th</sup> April that arrangements had been made for house refuse from Leigh Woods to be collected twice monthly.

Arising out of this it was resolved on the motion of Mr Childe seconded by Mr Bright that the attention of the District Council be drawn to the incivility of the Contractor when collecting refuse.

#### Fences, Council Houses, Providence

It was stated in a letter from the District Council of the 20 April that the fences on the Providence View Estate had now been put in order.

#### Rating and Valuation Act 1925

Clerk reported this Act was silent as to length of term of office of representatives on the Rating and Valuation Committee and read letter of the 1<sup>st</sup> May from the R D C on the matter.

Mr Tissington proposed, Mr Childe seconded that Mr Butter be re-appointed.

Mr Tissington moved and Mr Ball seconded that Mr Bright be the second representative.

Both propositions were carried such term of office to extend to the 31 March 1937 or until their successors are appointed.

#### Shelter

The Bristol Tramway and Carriage Co Ltd by letter of the 27 April that the provision of a shelter at the boundary of the parish had been considered by the company and immediately the bridge re-construction was completed, the matter would receive the very careful consideration of the Company.

#### Flushing Tank – Providence

The Clerk District Council wrote 26 April that this tank was in proper working order and working under the supervision of the Sanitary Inspector.

#### Leigh Woods Lighting Sub Committee – Report

This Report was adopted on the proposition of Mr Bright seconded by Mr Ball.

Arising out of this, Mr Bright moved seconded by Mr Mitchell that the lamp in Rayens Cross Road be moved to the pole below.

An amendment by Mr Ball seconded by Mr Fry that no alteration be made was carried by 3 votes to 2.

#### Lighting Committee

Mr Childe suggested that a Lighting Committee be formed and Messrs Ball, Bright, Childe, Mitchell and Tissington were appointed to act as a Lighting Committee on the motion of Mr Mitchell, seconded by Mr Fry.

#### Allotment Committee's Report

This Report was adopted on the motion of Mr Fry seconded by Mr Jefferies, the arrears of £1.2.6 and 15/- by Mr Hazell and M Ludlow respectively being treated as irrecoverable.

Arising out of same

Footpath – Clevedon Road

Letter from County Surveyor of 26 June was read in which he stated the removal of the electric lighting poles was an expensive matter and the expense not justified until such a time as the widening and general improvement of the road undertaken.

It was decided on the motion of Mr Mitchell seconded by Mr H S Barnes to draw the attention of the Minister of Transport to the narrowness of the footpath.

Repair of Footpaths

Clerk reported that Local Government Act 1933 neither varied nor repealed sub section 2 of Section 13 Local Government Act 1894 which dealt with the repair of footpaths.

Collection of House Refuse

Clerk R D Council in reply to this Council's letter, asked to be supplied with instances of the incivility of the House Refuse Contractor.

It being understood the Contractor had already been admonished the Council on the proposition of Mr Barnes seconded by Mr Childe decided to take no further action in the matter.

Manholes

The District Council by letter of 15 August stated the matter of manholes in church and Yanleigh Lane were receiving attention.

Clerkencombe Quarry

Letter from Mr A C Love of Uphill, Ridgeway as to permission to rent this quarry for concrete works was received and considered.

Left to Mr Fry to confer with Ashton Court Estate on the matter and if needs be, call special meeting of the Council.

## Report of Lighting Committee

This report, which dealt with the lighting of Leigh Woods was adopted on the motion of Mr Hicks, seconded by Mr Gait, subject to the charge for the lamps mentioned being at the rate of 50/- per lamp per annum.

## Allotment Committee's Report

Adopted on the proposition of Mr Tissington seconded by Mr Fry.

## Precept

It was decided to issue a Precept on the Rating Authority for £157.10 for the half year ending March next.

## Seats

Clerk reported that power to erect and maintain seats for the use of the public in any street or public place was given to the local authority by section 14 of the Public Health Act 1925 provided they adopted this section.

## Name Plates on roads

The erection of these was governed by Section 19 of the Act of 1925 but was not adoptive by R D Council. The County Council might have power as to Main Roads.

Mr Tissington moved that the County Council be asked to erect name plates of the various roads in the parish, seconded by Mr Barnes and carried.

## Providence

It was also decided to ask that more attention be given to the cleansing of Providence Road.

## Kings Silver Jubilee

Clerk drew Council's attention that the King's Silver Jubilee would fall on Monday May 6 1935 and that Mr Baldwin had stated it was the King's desire that any celebrations in connection with same should be of a local character.

Mr Tissington moved, Mr Bright seconding that a subcommittee be appointed to consider the matter and report at the next meeting. Carried.

Messrs Bright, Hicks, Jefferies and Tissington were appointed to act on this sub Committee with the Clerk (R E March) as convener.

#### Book

Mr Tissington moved, seconded by Mr Barnes that an up to date book on local government matters for the use of the Council be obtained and the cost divided between the Allotment and General Funds.

#### Rating Committee

Mr Bright reported attending meeting of this Committee on Aug 8.

#### Next Meeting

The date of the next meeting fixed for 11 December 1934.

#### Parish Council

Meeting of the Council held at the Church House, Long Ashton on Tuesday the 11<sup>th</sup> December 1934, all members present with exception of Messrs. Armstrong & Jefferies, Mr Fry presiding.

Minutes of previous meeting read and signed.

Arising out of same

Ashton Court Estate was seen by Mr Fry on the 19<sup>th</sup> September and by himself on the 6<sup>th</sup> December.

Mr Worrall handed the Clerk a letter he had received dated 15 March 1934 from the County Surveyor in which the latter stated he was not sure of the legal position with regard to a quarry that had been awarded to a parish.

After discussion, Mr Ball moved that the application of Mr A C Love on the 17<sup>th</sup> August 1934 for uses of this quarry, for the purpose of establishing works for the manufacture of concrete products be not entertained seconded by Mr Tissington and carried.

#### Quarry Dumps

Arising out of the aforementioned letter of the 15 March from the County Surveyor to the Ashton Court Estate in which it was stated he would like to retain a small portion of it for use as a dump or depot. Mr Mitchell moved that a letter be written the County Council expressing the hope that his quarry would not be used as a general refuse dump, seconded by Mr Gait and carried.

#### Naming of Streets

The Clerk of the County Council replied by letter of the 26<sup>th</sup> September that application should be addressed to the R D Council and this latter council by letter of the 8<sup>th</sup> November stated that instructions had been given to take the necessary steps for the erection of name plates in the various roads.

#### Cleansing of Providence Road

Formal acknowledgment of the Council's letter of the 25<sup>th</sup> September had been received.

#### Text Book

Purchase of this was on the proposition of Mr Tissington seconded by Mr S Mitchell left in the hands of the Clerk.

## Public Lighting – Leigh Woods

The North Somerset Electric Supply Co wrote by letter of the 18<sup>th</sup> September that the charge for the 14 lamps referred to in the Council's letter of the 13 September would be at the rate of 50/- per lamp per annum.

Clerk stated letters of appreciation had been received from Messrs Fursier, Parrish and Avery.

## Lighting – Leigh Woods

Letter of the 20 November was read from Mr Budgett of Birchwood, Leigh Woods stating that the new public lights were not satisfactory and the Clerk read reply of the 29<sup>th</sup> November in which he pointed out the reflectors were of a similar description to those in use in Long Ashton concerning which no complaint had been received.

It was unanimously agreed to write Mr Hollis a former member of the Council, tendering the members sympathies at the illness of his wife and to express the hope she may have a speedy recovery.

Lighting

The question of a lamp at the Bristol boundary of the parish was referred to the Lighting Committee.

Grass Allotment

Notice from the Somerset County Council to the occupier (Mr W E James) of a grass allotment to cut hedge in Wild Country Lane was referred to Allotment Committee.

Audit

Clerk stated audit of accounts for 1933/34 had been fixed for 21 January 1935.

Next Meeting

This was fixed for Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup> March.

Rating Committee

Mr Bright reported attending meeting October 3.

Diversion of footpath

The Council after special notice concerning same proceeded to consider application on behalf of the University of Bristol Agricultural Horticultural Research Station, Long Ashton for consent to divert a footpath on the north side of the Recreation Ground.

Notice of such meeting had been exhibited on the notice boards of the churches, chapel, as well as other conspicuous places in the parish.

After the application had been explained with the aid of a plan Mr Tissington proposed:

“That this Council consents to the application of the University of Bristol Agricultural and Horticultural Research Station, Long Ashton to stop up divert and turn a certain footpath at the north side of the Recreation Ground coloured black on the plan submitted to the Council and in lieu thereof to substitute a footpath along the line coloured red in the said plan”.

Seconded by Mr Mitchell and carried.

#### Allotment Committees Report – J Fudge Arrears of Rent

The Council understood that payments had been made since the last meeting.

It was decided on the motion of Mr Ball seconded by Mr Mitchell not to exercise execution as long as payments were made.

#### King's Silver Jubilee – Sub Committee's Report

Mr Ball proposed, Mr Mitchell seconded that same be adopted.

#### Rights of Way Act 1932

Plans were submitted by the Ashton Court Estate and the University of Bristol Agricultural and Horticultural Research Station showing footpaths on their respective property for the observations of the Council before same were deposited with the R D Council.

It was decided to inform the Ashton Court Estate that their plan did not agree with the footpaths as shown on the parish map.
